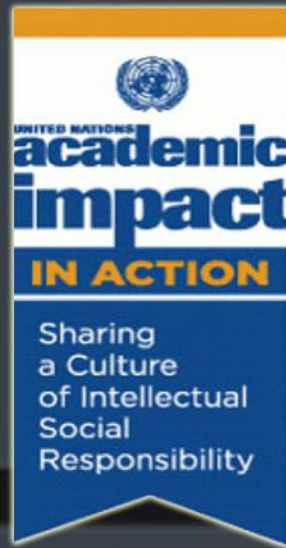

United Nations Academic Impact (UNAI) is a United Nations initiative to align institutions of higher education, scholarship and research with the United Nations and with each other. It is an organisation that actively supports and contributes to the realisation of UN goals and mandates including the promotion and protection of human rights, access to education, sustainability and conflict resolution.

The basic intention of the organisation is to generate a global movement of minds to promote a new culture of intellectual social responsibility. UNAI provides a collaborative platform where members can learn from each other and enhance each other's skills and tools. UNAI also provides information on UN activities and provides guidance on how students, professors and researchers can apply their knowledge to the work of the UN and make a difference in their classrooms, communities and campuses. 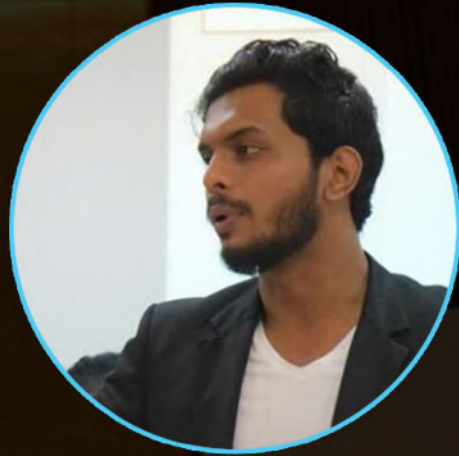

Responding to issues ranging from the Israeli–Palestinian conflict to the 2015 Eritrea Report, the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) has upheld its fidelity to strengthen the promotion and protection of human rights around the globe, ever since its inception in 2006. The UNHRC is an inter-governmental body, whose prime responsibility is to discuss all human rights issues and situations that require its attention and make recommendations on them. Comprising of special rapporteurs, special representatives, independent experts and working groups that monitor, examine and report on thematic issues or human rights situations around the globe, the UNHRC addresses important human rights issues such as freedom of expression, freedom of belief and religion, women's rights and LGBT rights, in addition to addressing related issues in all UN member states.

Being one of the six principal organs of the United Nations, the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) is primarily concerned with the maintenance of international peace and security, and takes decisions on accepting new members to the UN. Right from its first session on 17th January 1946, the UNSC and its decisions have been lucrative in maintaining world peace, doing justice to the reason of its founding following the World War II, along with the United Nations itself. With 15 members including five permanent members, the UNSC holds the power to establish peacekeeping operations and international sanctions and to authorize military actions through Security Council resolutions. As of 2016, the UNSC has deployed 103,510 peacekeepers and 16,471 civilians on sixteen peacekeeping operations and one special political mission.

Tourist Attractions

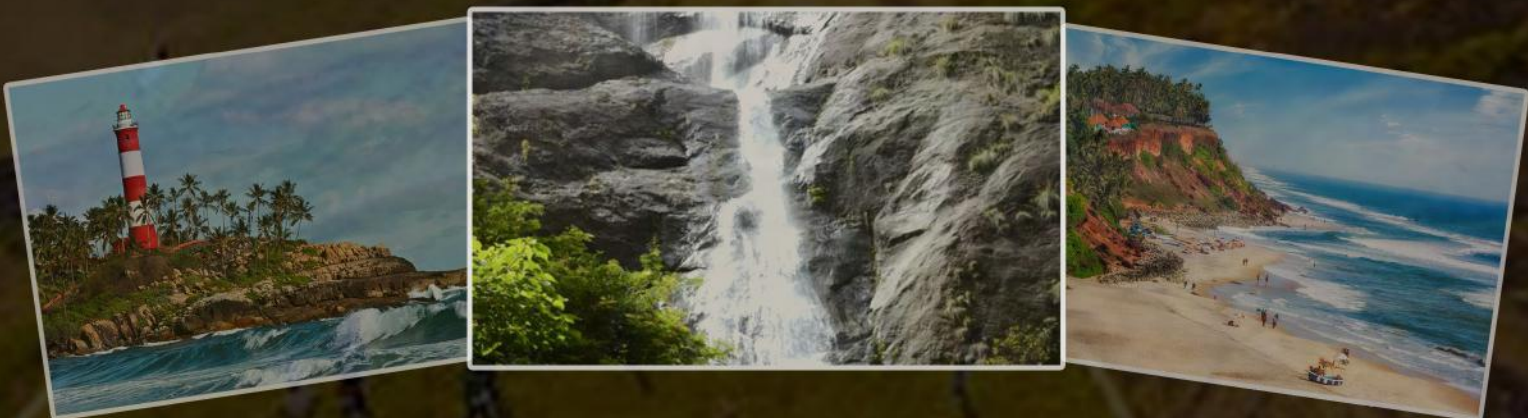
Varkala Beach and Viewpoint: The most popular tourist destination in the district is The Varkala Beach and Viewpoint. Seen as one of the best tourist spots in the state, the beach which is situated a distance of 20 km from the heart of Kollam. It features a scenic viewpoint and ample amount of space to have a day filled with sand, water and joy.

Jadayu Earth Center: Covering 65 acres of hills, valleys and vegetation, The Earth Center is a glorious example of sustainable and eco-friendly tourism in India, Located in the Chadayamangalam, district of Kollam, the area features great spots have a great outdoor picnic. It also features the Jadayu Rock which holds the largest bird sculpture known to mankind holding a guinness world record.

Thangasseri Lighthouse: It is one of two lighthouses in Kollam and is a popular tourist destination in the district. With a height of 41 metres, it is the second largest lighthouse in Kerala. It is also one of the most visited lighthouses in Kerala.

Palaruvi Falls: The meaning of the word “Palaruvi” is “Stream of Milk”. Keeping upto its meaning, the water at Palaruvi does look like milk flowing from a height. With a height of 300 metres, it is the 32nd highest waterfall in the state. It is connected to the Kallada River.

Ashtamudi Lake: This is the most visited backwater and lake in the state of Kerala. Ashtamudi means “eight coned”, the name derived from its topography with its multiple branches. It is also known as the Gateway to the backwaters of Kerala and is well-known for its houseboats and backwater resorts.
